

Abandonment of Motor Vehicle (8-2-10)

It is unlawful to abandon any motor vehicle on a street, highway, right of way or public property in town. A vehicle will be considered abandoned if the license plates are removed, it is left for more than (7) days or the vehicle does not operate, or police notify the owner to move the vehicle and it has not been moved within (3) days after the notification.

Vehicles Posted for Sale (8-2-50)

Vehicles posted for sale may not be parked on public property, any roadway or right-of-way. No more than (2) vehicles that are posted for sale may be parked on private property at one time. And these vehicles must be parked on concrete or gravel surfaces only.



Watering Restrictions (13-3-120)

Residents with even numbered street addresses may only water on Sundays, Tuesday and Thursdays, residents with odd numbered street addresses may only water on Saturdays, Mondays and Wednesdays. No watering is permitted between 9:00a.m and 7:00p.m. on any day. Watering of landscape areas or washing a car can be done anytime on your designated watering day with a hand held hose, bucket or watering can that is less than (5) gallons. A drip irrigation system may also be used.

Parking on Grass Prohibited (16-3-110(23))

All vehicles parked on private property must be parked on a paved or graveled driveway. Parking on the grass or dirt surfaces is prohibited.

Recreational Vehicles, Boats & Trailers Prohibited (16-3-120)

In all residential and commercial zones, recreational vehicles, boats and trailers must be parked in an enclosed structure such as a garage or storage shed, or can be parked outside on a driveway or on the side or rear yard, as long as they are on a gravel or concrete surface. They cannot be parked on the grass or dirt. They must also be parked so as not to blocking any part of a public sidewalk and must be as least (10) feet from any street or (5) feet from an alleyway. On private property, no more than (2) recreational vehicles, boats or trailers may be parked outside of an enclosed structure at one time.

Storage & Parking of Commercial Vehicles in a Residential Zone (16-3-130)

Registered commercial vehicles, excluding trailers, may be parked or stored on private property as long as they are in an enclosed structure or can be parked outside on a driveway or on the side or rear yard, as long as they are on a gravel or concrete surface. They cannot be parked on the grass or dirt. They must also be parked so as not to blocking any part of a public sidewalk and must be as least (10) feet from any street or (5) feet from an alleyway. No more than (2) commercial vehicles may be parked on private property, outside of an enclosed structure at one time.

Platteville Municipal Code Information

Deposit & Burning Restrictions (7-2-20)

A person shall not throw, leave or allow litter to accumulate on their property, or allow litter to blow or be washed onto property of another. A person shall not place litter in another person's trash receptacle without permission and shall not burn litter within the town limits. Litter includes but is not limited to: grass clippings, leaves, feces, trash or any type of refuse.



Removal of Graffiti (7-2-40)

It is the duty of the property owner or occupant of a residence to remove any graffiti placed anywhere on the property within (5) consecutive days.

Inoperable & Unlicensed Vehicles (7-2-50)

Property owners may keep (2) Collector's vehicles that do not operate or are not currently licensed on their property as long as they are enclosed in a structure (i.e. a garage, shed or other building) or behind a solid fence, as long as the vehicle is not visible from any public street or sidewalk. Inoperable or unlicensed vehicles that are not collector's vehicles may not be stored on any residential property.

A commercial property owner can store inoperable or unlicensed vehicles on their property as long as they are enclosed in a structure or behind a solid fence and are not visible from any public street or sidewalk.



Accumulation of Junk, Equipment or Furniture (7-2-60)

No property owner or occupant of a residence shall allow wrecked, junked, discarded or abandoned equipment, appliances, furniture, machines, vehicles or any other unused items to be placed, stored or accumulated anywhere on their property.



Noxious Vegetation & Weeds (7-4-30)

All owners or occupants of a residence shall keep the entire property, including from the outside of fences around the residence to the beginning of the streets or alleys, and on both sides of all sidewalks that surround a residence, free of noxious vegetation and weeds. All weeds and grass lawns must be kept cut at a height of (6) inches or less.



Dead & Diseased Trees (7-4-40)

A home owner or occupant may not store dead, dying or diseased branches or cut wood on their property, or have dead, dying or weakened branches in living trees.

Trees & Limbs in Public Right of Way (7-4-50)

A home owner or occupant must keep all trees trimmed so that their limbs are out of public right of ways and so they do not block visibility of street signs, or become a danger of falling on people or property.

Control of Trees & Shrubs (7-4-60)

A home owner or occupant may not have trees, shrubs or other vegetation on their property that is dead, broke or diseased.
